
In Room 21 we have used our knowledge of electrical circuits to create a game. We selected a topic of our own choice and then created 5 questions with answers for the game board.

Against Anxiety

What could our children do if they knew in their hearts they were brave enough? All children and teems are capable of their very own versions of greatness. For too many though, anxiety will shut down their capacity to discover their potential - but it doesn't have to be this way. - how to build the mindset that will strengthen against anxiety and make way for brave behaviour;
 how to build the solid neural foundations of resilience in all children;
- why new behaviours take time, why old responses can feel tough to change, and the simple explanation for children and teens that can build resilience and grit.

Because we know our children are mighty. Now to make sure they know it too.
