

# FROM THE PRINCIPAL'S DESK



It has been an exciting week this week with our P&C organised Colour Run. It was an absolute joy to see our community on the oval, enjoying coming together. I would like to offer my heartfelt thank you to our P&C members who not only organised our event, but also rearranged themselves very quickly when we realised the weather was not going to be in our favour. To our students and families, I offer my thank you for raising a large sum of money towards the P&C fundraising efforts. I look forward to sharing more about the planning for this funds, and how we can utilise to refresh our playground spaces.

Over the coming weeks, we have many events and opportunities to come together. It is also a busy time for us as a school as we finalise recruitment and work hard to predict our enrolment numbers for next year. This prediction helps us to build our budget for next year. For example, if we predict 420 students, we build our class structure and staffing based on that prediction. When we are confident that these predictions are right, and things are not likely to change, I can provide information to our parents. However, sometimes, due to new enrolments or students leaving,

it is hard to get this right, and it is not able to be released to the community. One thing I know about this time of the year is that information that is not stable (as in, it may change), can be really hard for students, teachers and families. It is always a balancing act. So I ask for patience and trust that as soon as we have information which is not likely to change, I will share it with the community. It is always my goal to advise the community as soon as I can, and this remains my goal for this year. Last week, I spoke with our School Board about how students are placed in classes, and how we make financial decisions that link to our school Business Plan. I would like to invite all families to attend our Open Board Meeting on Monday 5th December, 6:30pm, if they would like some insight into what our school planning looks like for 2023.

I look forward to celebrating my first end of year events at Adam Rd PS over the coming weeks, and trust that I will see many of you in attendance.



# FORENSIC FUN




**Year six students in Room 21 have been studying Crime and Punishment and the Forensic science techniques used to solve crimes. We looked at different crimes that have been committed during different periods of history: Roman, Medieval, Victorian and modern times and the various punishments that would have been dealt to offenders.**

We also listened to the story of Dr Jeckyl and Mr Hyde and discussed how evil lives in all of us but how most of us manage to keep it hidden.

Activities included Dactylography (finger printing) Cheiloscopy (lip prints) Odontology (teeth prints) Hair analysis, Chromatography (separating chemicals) and analysing odours using our Olfactory sense.

We learnt many interesting things which we were able to apply to our shoe box model (diorama) of a crime scene.

## BOOK SWAP - BRING A BOOK TAKE A BOOK

Does your child have books that they have already read? Bring them in to the BOOK SWAP, an inexpensive way for children to obtain new books.
