## FROM THE PRINCIPAL'S DESK



Welcome to our first newsletter for Term 4. It is a busy term, with many opportunities to celebrate our students and their individual successes. I'm sure you know that we have our Faction Carnival events next week – with more information to come out late this week for parents.

On Monday, we held a Reset Assembly to discuss our School Values and expectations as we start a new term. We spoke about the rights of every individual to come to school and feel safe, and that this included during play. In particular, we acknowledge that footy, basketball and soccer are all extremely enjoyable games, but only when playing under modified rules at school to keep everyone safe. No-one has the right to make another person feel unsafe, and everyone was reminded about the expectation of keeping their body to themselves. I would appreciate that parents reinforce this message at home, and encourage students to seek help from teachers on duty if they need it to solve a problem that may have come up during play.

Additionally, I would like to remind parents that supervision in the mornings does not commence until 8:15am. This supervision is provided for students where their parents need to go to work, or for another reason which is unavoidable that they are at school before 8:30am. I would like to thank families who direct their children to the Assembly Area for supervision between before 8:30 – it supports our teachers to complete their preparation without interruptions, and ensures our students are supervised and kept in a safe environment.

We are looking forward to a great few weeks with warmer weather, so I encourage everyone to bring their hats to school and enjoy the opportunity to play in our amazing outdoor environments that we have here at school. I am looking forward to my first Adam Road Faction Carnival Week and seeing many parents there in attendance.
